



Marking the day



According to church tradition, June 29th is the anniversary of the Apostle Paul's martyrdom. Christians around the world reflect this day on the legacy of those who have given their lives to

spread the Good News of Christ's death and resurrection, paving the way for our salvation.

This year, The Voice of the Martyrs commemorates the day by remembering the Christians who were persecuted in Mosul, Iraq, ten years ago. At that time, militants from the self-proclaimed Islamic State (ISIS) advanced across Syria and northern Iraq. As they entered each village, they marked Christians' homes and businesses with the Arabic letter "N," or ن, for "Nazarene."

This symbol served to identify and threaten Christians, who then had a difficult decision to make: Convert to Islam, leave the area or be killed. This month, we honor the costly stand many took to bring glory to God in a dark time and place.
